### Honoring scientists who have made pioneering contributions to communications technology and information science

The Marconi Society, a foundation dedicated to advancements in the Internet and communications that benefit humankind, proudly offers the annual Marconi Prize.

The \$100,000 annual Prize recognizes outstanding individuals who have made significant contributions to advancing communications through scientific discoveries and entrepreneurship. We welcome diverse nominations from around the world and across the disciplines of communications and information sciences.

### **We invite nominations through July 31, 2018 for the 2019 Marconi Prize.**

Prize winners become Marconi Fellows, joining a distinguished group of scientists that includes Internet pioneers Vint Cerf, Robert Kahn, Len Kleinrock and Tim Berners-Lee, wireless pioneers Marty Cooper, Andrew Viterbi and Irwin Jacobs, and encryption pioneers Whit Diffie, Ron Rivest and Martin E. Hellman.

Marconi Fellows are considered leaders in their fields. The group includes numerous Turing Award winners, Franklin Medal winners, IEEE Medal of Honor and Claude Shannon Award winners, as well as dozens of Fellows in the National Academy of Engineering, Royal Academy of Engineering, ACM, and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.

Marconi Fellows are expected to be active in the Society and to mentor the Society's Paul Baran Young Scholars, a diverse group of young scientists and engineers who are creating the technology that will shape the next generation of the Internet and communications.

We welcome nominations for professionals with entrepreneurial spirit and outstanding technical achievements that are widely implemented to improve the lives of others. **Deadline July 31.**
